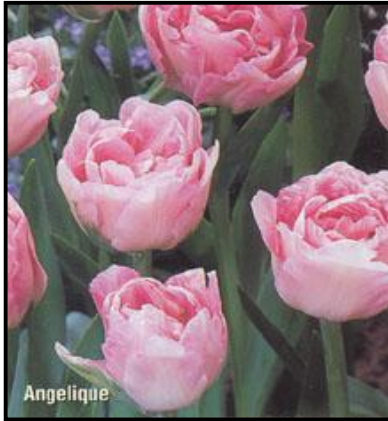


# Angelique" - A Double Tulip

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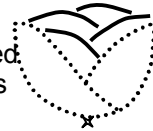
The double tulip, Angelique, has soft, bluish pink, rose-like flowers with lighter and darker shades mixed in and is very fragrant.

Floss: Lola #083 (4 strands)  
Iris #149 (4 strands)



## Petals: Lola 083

- \* Fill the lower cupped part of the tulip (area with dotted lines) with long and short satin stitch, angling stitches to meet at the stem.
- \* Referring to pattern at right, place up-down cast-on stitches as follows:
  - #1 – 12-loop up-down cast-on\*
  - #2 – 8-loop up-down cast-on
  - #3 – 12-loop up-down cast-on
  - #4 – 12-loop up-down cast-on
  - #5 – 15-loop up-down cast-on
  - #6 – 20-loop up-down cast-on\*\*



\*The fabric bite for #1-#5 is:  $\begin{matrix} \bullet & \bullet \\ a & c \end{matrix}$   $\begin{matrix} \bullet & \bullet \\ d & b \end{matrix}$

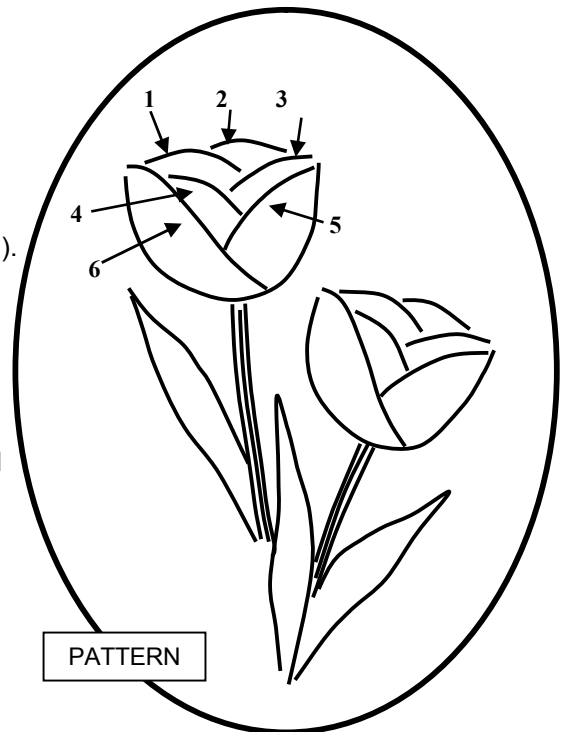
\*\*The fabric bite for #6 is:  $\begin{matrix} \bullet & \bullet \\ a & c \end{matrix}$   $\begin{matrix} \bullet & \bullet \\ b & d \end{matrix}$   
This will cause the petal to curve.

## Stems: Iris 149

- \* Make 3 rows of Brazilian outline stitch (floss below line of stitching).
- \* Whip stitch the 3 rows together as one.

## Leaves: Iris 149

- \* Fill the leaves with parallel rows of Brazilian outline stitch. This will give the look of realism to your tulip leaves.
